Dear Senator Rosen and Senator Cassidy:

The undersigned national organizations in the mental and behavioral health community write to express our strong support for the *Expanding Access to Mental Health Training Act* (S.4461). This legislation will reauthorize and expand the Mental Health Awareness Training (MHAT) program, an important grant program administered by the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Administration.

As you know, the MHAT program provides grant funding to help train individuals to respond to mental health crises and to support those living with mental health disorders. It funds programs which help participants recognize the signs and symptoms of mental disorders and to connect those with mental health disorders to school or community-based mental health agencies.

The MHAT program also provides funding to train emergency services personnel, Veterans, law enforcement officers, and others to de-escalate mental health crises. The program also helps raise awareness of existing resources that are available for individuals living with a mental health disorder.

The *Expanding Access to Mental Health Training Act* will reauthorize and extend the MHAT program, authorizing additional funding for the program and extending its authorization through fiscal year 2027. This legislation will expand the scope of the MHAT program to include suicide intervention and prevention training as an eligible use of grant funding.

By improving and reauthorizing the MHAT program, S.4461 will help countless Americans impacted by mental and behavioral health disorders. We respectfully urge its swift passage, and we thank you for your continued leadership and dedication to this important issue.
